ORDINANCE NO.	
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An ordinance

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directing that the County Administrator revise the Unified Government's employment application by eliminating the field requiring the disclosure of past criminal convictions; specifying when inquiries about an applicant's criminal history may be made; excluding certain criminal records from consideration in determining whether to hire an applicant; specifying that all other information possessed about an applicant's criminal history shall be considered; exempting certain positions; and urging private employers to adopt fair hiring practices that encourage the rehabilitation of people with criminal records.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE UNIFIED GOVERNMENT OF WYANDOTTE COUNTY/KANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. Purposes. The Board of Commissioners is committed to ensuring that the Unified Government's hiring practices are fair to all members of the community and that individuals with criminal histories have the opportunity for employment with the Unified Government consistent with the safety and welfare of the public and other Unified Government employees.

Section 2. Employment application; elimination of field requiring disclosure of past criminal convictions; exceptions. The County Administrator shall revise the Unified Government's employment application to eliminate the field requiring disclosure of past criminal convictions for all positions except those exempted in Section 6.

Section 3. Employment applicants; inquiry about criminal history; when. No inquiry shall be made about the criminal history of an applicant for employment with the Unified Government until after the applicant has been determined to be otherwise qualified and has been interviewed for the position sought.

Section 4. Hiring; exclusion of certain criminal records from consideration. The following criminal records shall not be considered in determining whether to hire an applicant for a position with the Unified Government: records of arrests not followed by a valid conviction, unless the criminal case is actively pending or the applicant has admitted guilt; convictions that have been overturned or vacated; and convictions that have been annulled or expunged.

Section 5. Same; all other information possessed about criminal history to be considered. In deciding whether to hire an applicant for a position with the Unified

Government, all other information possessed about the applicant's criminal history shall be considered, including the nature and gravity of the offense or offenses, the time that has passed since the applicant's conviction or release from incarceration, the relevance of the offense to the job sought, and any evidence of rehabilitation.

Section 6. Exempt positions. The following positions are exempted from all requirements of this ordinance: Public safety positions (including sworn and civilian positions in the Police Department, Sheriff's Office, Fire Department, Department of Community Corrections, District Attorney's Office, and Municipal Court); any position for which the Unified Government is required by federal or state law to conduct a criminal history record check; and any position for which federal or state law specifically disqualifies an applicant with a criminal background.

Section 7. Private employers. The Unified Government urges private employers to adopt fair hiring practices that encourage the rehabilitation of people with criminal records.

Section 8. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on January 1, 2015, after its passage, approval, and publication in the official Unified Government newspaper.
